LOOSE ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS & JURAT CERTIFICATES THAT EVERY NOTARY SHOULD KEEP ON HAND

Used when:

- There is not a notary certificate on the document.
 On documents presented without a notary certificate (e.g. a handwritten letter), you must <u>ask</u> the signer which type of notarization they want (acknowledgement or jurat), and explain the difference
- The certificate wording is incorrect, or not Ohiocompliant
- There is not sufficient space on the document to notarize, especially if stamp/seal will not fit. No document wording can be covered
- Staple the top two corners of the loose certificate to the document, and write "See attached certificate" on the bottom of the document.
