## **Ohio Notary Public Modernization Act**

## Signed into law by Governor Kasich 12/19/2018 - Effective 9/20/19

- **Eliminates** the 88 separate county notary criteria; **all** notary applications are handled **ONLINE** *directly to the Secretary of State.*
- New Notary applicants will be required to 1) Pass a statewide, uniform examination; 2) Pass a <u>BCI</u> background check (with fingerprints); 3) Receive 3 hours of mandatory training. <u>This includes new attorneys</u>. *Renewing notaries* will receive a 1-hour training class and pass the BCI check; no re-test required.
- Eliminates commission recording with County Clerks of Court
- Defines Jurat certificate wording
- Requires notaries to ensure their notarial certificate accurately shows the notarial act being performed, or to correct it.
- Allows Copy Certification by Document Custodian
- No Bond Requirement; Journals are optional
- Prohibit certain felons from holding a notary commission
- Permits reasonable travel fees
- Increases fees for any notarial act up to \$5 per notarization
- Maintains satisfactory ID acceptance to Notary's discretion
- Allows reduction in required size of Notary Seal
- Eliminates Notary Protests
- Notary Complaints & Disciplinary actions handled by SOS
- Allows a "Designated Signer" for disabled/incapacitated signers
- Upon death or resignation, journals to be deposited with SOS
- Permits notarization via video devices
